Small Group Sessions Include:

What is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program that offers schools in Virginia funds for assistance to work with students that need additional support in Reading. Schools receive funds to hire fully licensed staff to assist classroom teachers with offering small group reading tutoring to those of highest need.

As part of the ESEA Consolidated Grant, students at Dinwiddie, Southside, Sunnyside and Sutherland Elementary are afforded daily 30 – 45 minutes of Title I assistance as part of small group classroom instruction. Students qualifying for services are given additional reading support within their classrooms during small group reading instructional time that is built into every classroom schedule. During this time, students read at their instructional level and are taught skills for their grade level through appropriate reading texts. All students are afforded assistance, materials, and growth opportunities.
