Proposed Calendars: Pre- and Post-Labor Day Start

Dr. Royal Gurley, Assistant Superintendent, presented and the School Board approved the school calendars for the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years. For the 2021-2022 school year, school will have a post-Labor Day start on September 7, 2021. For the 2022-2023, school will have a pre-Labor Day start on August 22, 2022.

Return to Learn

Christie Clarke, Director of School & Community Relations, provided a Return to Learn update for Quarter 4. There are currently 58% in-person learners and 42% virtual learners. The plan for the 2021-2022 school year is to provide in-person instruction for all grades five days per week. We plan to have limited virtual options. A survey will be sent to the current virtual learners within the next few weeks. A health data update was provided. Cases continue to be tracked daily. The weekly snapshot is available on the Covid Dashboard on the DCPS website. The board approved an update to the Health Mitigation Plan to eliminate the daily temperature assessments at school. We ask that all families and staff continue to conduct the daily health questionnaire before arriving to school. Please continue to practice good hand hygiene and stay home when sick. Information was shared about the recent updates to Governor Northam's Executive Order #72 and how it pertains to schools. The main impacts include gathering limits, recreational sports, and graduation.

Superintendent Matters

Class of 2021 Update

Robbie Garnes, Dinwiddie High Principal, and Andrea Sims, Graduation Committee Chair, provided information about the Class of 2021 upcoming events. On May 15, they will hold *A Night to Remember* celebration at the school. Information will be provided to the students at their upcoming Senior Meeting. Andrea Sims provided a Graduation Update and shared the current plan based on the Governor's Executive Order that is in effect at this time. They will continue to monitor for any changes and make updates as appropriate. They continue to explore alternative venues that could accommodate an outdoor ceremony. The school will continue to update parents as they have any new information.

Dinwiddie Drive Pilot

The Transportation Department will be piloting a new parent app called **Tyler Drive**. This will allow parents to follow his/her child's bus route. Students will scan their ID cards when boarding the bus. An estimated time of arrival will be given and it updates as the bus is in route. The system also has the capability of sending late bus notifications. Dinwiddie Elementary will be piloting this program starting on April 19. The pilot will be monitored and will be expanded to include all other schools soon.

Virginia Mathematics Pathway Initiative

Carly Woolfolk, Director of Secondary Education & CTE, gave a **presentation** on the new Virginia Mathematics Pathways Initiative for students.

Public Hearing - FY2022 Proposed School Budget
