As Dinwiddie County Public Schools plans for the start of the 2021-2022 school year, we are committed to keeping our families, staff, students, and community members informed.

Dinwiddie County Public Schools will provide in-person instruction in all grades five days per week beginning with the first day of school on Tuesday, September 7, 2021. A virtual learning option as an alternative for those students who have continued medical needs and/or demonstrated they could thrive academically via the online learning model is being offered to those students that have been accepted in the Dinwiddie Virtual Academy.

We will provide weekly updates relative to school opening each Thursday on the DCPS website leading up to the first day of school on September 7, 2021.

Dinwiddie Virtual Academy

For students enrolled in the Dinwiddie Virtual Academy, Mr. Chuck Moss, Director of Innovation & Development will hold an information session for families. More information will be provided to families.

SUPPLIES

School supply lists are posted on each school's website under the Family Resources tab. To help students have a successful start to the year, basic school supplies are being provided to students entering preschool and kindergarten through a partnership between Dinwiddie County Public Schools and our local faith-based community.

HEALTH & SAFETY MEASURES

We continue to monitor the latest information and guidance being provided from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), Virginia Department of Health (VDH), and Virginia Department of Education (VDOE).

While the local and state mandates have expired, the State Health Commissioner issued a Public Health Order for Virginia K-12 schools that requires all individuals ages 5 and older to wear masks indoors at K-12 schools in order to inhibit spread of the virus, as recommended by the CDC. This Health Order applies to indoor instruction. Masks do not have to be worn outdoors. This Order remains in effect until July 25, 2021.

On July 21, the Virginia Department of Education and Virginia Department of Health released new guidance for schools based on the most recent CDC information. School divisions will be able to establish and enforce their own local guidelines regarding mitigation practices. This will be based on the local data and community-level conditions. Dinwiddie County Public Schools will continually monitor conditions and make adjustments as needed.

In anticipation of having students and staff back in our school buildings, DCPS remains committed to implement a variety of health and safety measures. These include the following mitigation strategies that will be presented to the Dinwiddie School Board for approval at the August 10 meeting:

Self-Health Checks

All students and staff should continue to self-monitor one's health. Individuals should stay home when sick to help prevent the spread of illness. Any individuals determined to have a fever and/or display symptoms of illness will be sent home immediately by the school nurse.

Handwashing

Students and staff will be regularly reminded about the importance of proper handwashing. Teachers may allow for more breaks to give students the opportunity to wash their hands, either at a classroom sink or in a restroom.

In addition, we will continue to use the hand sanitizer units throughout our buildings. Students and staff will be encouraged to use hand sanitizer regularly.

Masks and PPE

Although we will not require students or staff to wear masks or other personal protective equipment (PPE), these items will be allowed and encouraged for any individual that is not fully vaccinated. We are committed to fostering a respectful environment in which there are no stigmas associated with wearing masks.

Covid-19 Vaccinations

The Covid-19 vaccine is recommended for any individual over the age of 12. DCPS is not requiring this vaccine for school attendance. We will continue to work with the Crater Department of Health to make the vaccine accessible to our students and staff.

Drinking Fountains

Most of the water fountains have been retrofitted into water filling stations. We recommend that all students bring water bottles to school so that they can refill them at a bottle filling station. Students should not share water bottles with others.

CLEANING & DISINFECTING

Our custodial staff will continue to maintain a high level of cleanliness and disinfecting of public spaces and high-touch surfaces across our buildings and throughout the school day. We will continue to provide access to cleaning materials for our teachers and staff so that they can clean and disinfect spaces, as needed.

MEAL SERVICES

All schools within the division will be participating in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) as implemented under the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010. All students in grades PK-12 will be provided free breakfast and lunch daily. Families will not have to complete meal applications this year.

Cafeteria

Meal service in the cafeteria will resume at each school.

Virtual Student Meal Service

Students participating in the Dinwiddie Virtual Academy are eligible for meals. Meals can be picked up each Wednesday that school is in session from 4-6 p.m. at the Dinwiddie Elementary School cafeteria loading dock. Five breakfast meals and five lunch meals will be provided at the pick up.

TECHNOLOGY ACCESS

In the event that all students will need to engage in remote or online learning during the school year, the district will provide chromebooks for students as needed. Students in grades PK-8 will utilize devices at school during the school year. High school students will be issued chromebooks during the first week of school. Dinwiddie Virtual Academy students will be issued chromebooks prior to start of classes.

ATHLETICS & EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Athletics and extracurricular activities will be offered for students without restrictions. DCPS will follow the guidelines and recommendations set forth by the Virginia High School League (VHSL).
