- 3. If you are keying the Works Cited entries, you must use italics for book, magazine, or newspaper titles. If you are hand-writing them, underline the title.
- 4. Works Cited entries use a hanging indention format, i.e., the first line aligns with the left margin and each additional line is indented 5 spaces. To create this format using the on-screen ruler, see a librarian or English teacher for instructions. Do not [ENTER] at the end of a line.
- 5. URLs: Some instructors will require the full URL address in the citation.
